

Week 1: Tues 16 - Fri 19 July 2024

Courses for adults

Life Drawing (All Levels) | Tutor: Annabel Cullen

The course is open to both beginners and the experienced student alike. The emphasis will be on observation, building upon basic principles of drawing and moving towards personal expression through experimentation with various media and techniques.

The aim of the course is to encourage students to develop their drawing and painting skills via access to what some consider the most compelling form, the human body.

Good Artists Copy Great Artists Steal: James McNeil Whistler

| Tutor: Ian Ellis

On the first day, through demonstration, ideas are presented about how the techniques of Whistler, his compositions, colour contrasts and layering techniques. You then select your own paintings to study. On day 2 morning session, using charcoal you will search for compositions using atmospheric photos of The River Thames as the starting point. In the afternoon the focus will be on creating small scale colour studies constructing layers of gesture paintings working with both your own intuitive feel for colour and any ideas identified during the first day's analysis. On Day 3, using the small studies of day two as a starting point you will attempt a larger scale atmospheric painting of the Thames River.

Expressive Pastels: Landscapes | *Tutor: Shaun Carey*

A one-day workshop exploring chalk pastels. Known for its vibrant effects, chalk pastel is a great medium, combining colour and drawing with an expressive immediacy. We will be working from landscape images, and you will learn and develop pastel techniques beginning with a broad approach to suggesting details. If you enjoy drawing but feel that colour is something that you wish to add to your repertoire, chalk pastel is an ideal medium for you.



Pastel Portraits | Tutor: Shaun Carey

Working directly from the model, we will explore the immediacy of chalk pastel, it's unique ability to create a likeness through the freshness of the medium. Beginning with initial drawing, placing proportions, we will make a tonal study then move onto pastel technique and colour. This is an ideal opportunity to develop your pastel and drawing skills, enjoying the expressive qualities of the medium.



Photographs offer wonderful opportunities for artists.

First and foremost, they make available a huge range of object matter. But perhaps more interestingly photographs have particular qualities, viewpoints and sometimes incongruities which the artist can utilise. You will be shown a number of ways to use photographs for making oil paintings, as well as looking at the work of relevant artists.

Egg Tempera | *Tutor: Paige Barry*

Egg tempera is a painting technique that was a primary method of painting until after 1500 when it was superseded by the invention of oil painting. It is a permanent, fast-drying painting medium, consisting of coloured pigments mixed with a water-soluble binder medium of egg yolk.

This two-day course will teach the basics including making your own paints, which grounds and varnishes to use as well as techniques for applying the paint to the gesso panel. The course is structured so that you will have a beautiful work of art at the end.

Open Studio Etching | Tutor: Melanie Bellis

Open studio Etching sessions are available to those who already have experience of etching and are interested in developing their own projects. This is an opportunity to work independently and develop your work. Tutor input and support is available throughout if needed.

3 Days: Screenprinting Workshop (Beginners) | Tutor: Justine Ellis

For beginners and a refresher for those with previous experience of screen printing, the course aims to cover the core principles of screen printing for beginners and provide those familiar with the practice an opportunity to have 3 full days of printing to consolidate a project or work on something new. For those new to screen printing - please bring an image with you that you would turn into a screen print. This could simply be something from your sketch book, a drawing or painting that you have made in another class or a photograph that you have taken.

3 Days: Screenprinting workshop (Inter / Adv) | *Tutor: Justine Ellis*

For students with previous experience of screen printing, the course will provide an opportunity to have 3 full days of printing to consolidate a project or work on something new.







Lino Printing Day | Tutor: Paul Schofield

The course will cover the creation of your design, colour mixing and finishing to a professional standard whilst exploring relief printing using lino blocks in just one day. The workshop begins with the basic techniques through planning your design, creating your linocut block, mixing colours and printing onto a range of paper.



2 Days: Drypoint & Chine Colle | Tutor: Melanie Bellis

An opportunity to explore the exciting results that can be achieved by combining, Drypoint and Chine Collé. Drypoint is a printmaking method that involves scratching a design into a surface using a range of tools, then making a print from the design using a printing press. Chine Collé is a method of adding colour to all or part of your print using Japanese or other thin paper. You will learn each technique and how to combine them to build up layered images.

Open Studio: Pottery | *Tutor: Leigh Jenkinson / Simon Ashworth / Delyth Jones* Open studio sessions are available to those that already have experience working with clay and are interested in working on their own projects. You will be expected to manage the progress of your own work although advice will be available if required.

2 Days: Life Sculpture (All Levels) | Tutor: Eithne Healy

On this course you will explore the possibilities and limitations of clay. You will do this through a variety of structured exercises based on direct observation from the life model. You will gain a basic understanding of how to render proportion and will learn how to apply perspective. You will learn through the process of making a series of clay studies. There will be tutor demonstrations and individual guidance.

Pottery: Glazing Workshop | *Tutor: Leigh Jenkinson*

This course will go over the common pitfalls of glazing, how to glaze your pots successfully and think about designing your pots for easy glazing. We will also work on testing glazes and building up a collection of test tiles. The course will also discuss using oxides and colourants, the importance of temperature, and how to mix your own glazes. You will also have instruction on how to use the spray booth.

2 Days: Travel Photography | Tutor: Neil White

This course is designed for those who own a digital camera of any sort and want to maximise your camera's potential and learn the fundamental skills to improve your travel photography. This will be done by demystifying some of the elements of photography and making the process as simple as possible. We will look at photographing people, urban landscapes, capturing beautiful light and much more. The course will include interactive lectures, critiques sessions of your pictures and looking at well-known photographers work in this field. There will be a substantial practical element with lively photo shoots in various locations in the city. We will also look at image postproduction using Adobe Photoshop. Expert knowledge and tips will be given from a professional photographer who has experience of travel photography.

Photoshops for Artists and Illustrators | Tutor: Paige Barry

Photoshop is an incredibly useful tool for managing image creation and preparation. We will work with both drawings and photographs. For illustrators, it is a fantastic chance to see how your original images can easily be enhanced by changing and manipulating effects and colours, and easily adding typography to your work. For printmakers, we explore unique ways of preparing photographs and images for producing separations for the printing process. On this one-day course, we will cover a simple topic that we will work on together. You will be given plenty of time to work on your own projects using techniques we have covered.

Open Studio Photoshop | *Tutor: Paige Barry*

Open studio sessions are available to those that already have experience of using photoshop and are interested in developing their own projects. You will be expected to manage the progress of your own work although advice will be available as required from an experienced tutor.

2 Days: Introduction to Pottery | Tutor: Leigh Jenkinson

This two-day workshop will introduce beginners to the basic throwing and handbuilding techniques for creating forms in clay. Your experienced tutor will also demonstrate these techniques and guide you with your own work.

Learn to Draw Taster | *Tutor: Sophie Ambrose*


On this one day 'taster' course, you'll be introduced to some of the basic skills of observational drawing, including line, space, tone and proportion. There'll be demos and plenty of one-to-one attention and examples of artists work to inspire you during this relaxed, friendly class.

Mixing & Painting with Colour for Beginners | Tutor: Sophie Ambrose

A practical introduction to using colour and mixing colours for painting or design. With tutor demos and exercises to help improve your colour mixing and painting.

This course is for you if:

- You've done some drawing and want to learn to paint
- You are interested in design and want to explore colour
- You'd like your art to have more depth and balance



Painting in Oils: Getting Started | *Tutor: Shaun Carey*

Do you want to paint in oils but don't know where to start? This two-evenings course with an experienced painter will give you the core skills and techniques to begin your own paintings. The course will teach you how to vary oil painting technique, mix colour and create a sense of light when painting still life objects.

Introduction to Drawing | Tutor: Paul Schofield

You will learn the basic principles of observational drawing, beginning with simple shapes and proportion through to conveying volume and space. You will learn to use pencil, charcoal and other medium to describe form and light. Using a variety of materials, you will explore different forms of description and expression.

Mixed Media: Acrylic and Water Mixable Oils

| Tutor: Paige Barry

Whether you're new to painting or exploring new methods in your practice, this class is for you. The course begins with a review of colour theory as it relates to layering, mixing and glazing paint. Next, we will learn how to get the most out of acrylic paints by these same methods and adding mediums. Acrylic is a great way to paint fast and loose and can also be used as a base for oil painting. After exploring how to get the most of acrylics, we will add the use of oil paint to create a painting using both.



Courses for Young People

2 Days: Art and Design for Young People 13-17 years

| Tutor: Paul Schofield

An enjoyable and challenging 2-day course designed to build on existing skills to create a varied body of work useful for GCSE and A level course work or for a dynamic foundation portfolio. The course aims to explore drawing and painting media in depth, to explore line, tone and structure then introducing colour and further mark making techniques with pastels, watercolour, gouache, ink and wash.

For Children and families

Family Learning Pottery | Tutor: Belinda Bates

Have fun making and decorating clay pots and figures. There will be a themed project and materials are supplied. Your work will be fired once, if collected later. For parent and child aged 7-13 working together.

Kids Pottery Club | *Tutor: Chud Clowes*

The course is an enjoyable and creative pottery club for children to express themselves through the medium of clay. There will be a themed project and materials are supplied. Your work will be fired once, if collected later. Age range: 8-12 years not accompanied by adult.


Family Learning Drawing & Painting | Tutor: Antonia Reina

The course is an enjoyable and creative art club for children to express themselves through drawing, painting, printing and mixed media. There will be a new project each session and materials are provided. Age range: 8-12 not accompanied by an adult.







Week 2: Mon 22 July - Fri 26 July 2024

Courses for adults

3 Days: Life Drawing with two models | Tutor: Jan Malaszek

This three-day course gives you the opportunity to explore the dynamics and compositional possibilities of working with two life models. Using a variety of drawing media and working from poses of various lengths you will focus on negative & positive shapes, rhythms, mark making and the use of dramatic lighting to create a range of drawings on different surfaces and papers.

2 Days: Figurative Drawing Beginners |

Tutor: Shaun Carey


This two-day course will provide a useful introduction (or refresher) to drawing from the figure. Through a variety of exercises and approaches you will explore different ways of looking and representing the figure. You will learn how to assess shape, proportion and direction, appreciate and represent volume and space, and consider how to convey the character and energy of a pose. Some general drawing experience is very helpful but not a requirement.

Good Artists Copy Great Artist Steal by The River Thames: Oil Painting - Frank Auerbach

Tutor: Ian Ellis

On day 1, through demonstration, ideas are presented about the techniques of Auerbach, his wet-on-wet oil techniques, his colour and compositions. You will then select paintings for your own individual study.

On day 2 and 3, using charcoal, on location by the Thames, you will search for composition. Then, you will attempt to construct your own paintings working with both your own intuitive feel for colour and any ideas identified during the first day's analysis.



Open studio painting sessions are available to those that already have experience of working with a painting medium and are interested in progressing their own projects. You will be expected to manage the progress of your own work although advice will be available if required from an experienced tutor. You will work in a large painting studio with specialist lighting. You can use this time and space to finish existing projects or begin new ones.



2 Days: Introduction to Watercolour | Tutor: Paul Dixon

You will be taught the basic skills and techniques of watercolour, such as mixing, layering, washes and use of materials [paper, brushes, paints etc.] Different subjects will be explored, such as landscape, and still life. Demonstrations will be given to gain an understanding of how to approach and manipulate watercolour in different ways.

Expressive Pastels: Still Life | *Tutor: Shaun Carey*

A one-day workshop exploring chalk pastels. Known for its vibrant effects, chalk pastel is a great medium, combining colour and drawing with an expressive immediacy. We will be working from still life and you will learn and develop pastel techniques beginning with a broad approach to suggesting details. If you enjoy drawing but feel that colour is something that you wish to add to your repertoire, chalk pastel is an ideal medium for you.

2 Days: Screenprinting Workshop (Beginners) | Tutor: Justine Ellis

For beginners and a refresher for those with previous experience of screen printing, the course aims to cover the core principles of screen printing for beginners and provide those familiar with the practice an opportunity to have 2 full days of printing to consolidate a project or work on something new. You will experiment with different kinds of expressive and gestural mark making, combining different techniques to build up images in layers.

Open Studio Etching | *Tutor: Melanie Bellis*

Open studio Etching sessions are available to those who already have experience of etching and are interested in developing their own projects. This is an opportunity to work independently and develop your work. Tutor input and support is available throughout if needed.





The course will cover the creation of your design, colour mixing and finishing to a professional standard whilst exploring relief printing using lino blocks in just one day. 2 Days: Collagraph Printmaking | Tutor: Paul Schofield

A two-day course where you will create collagraph plates using simple found materials, textured papers, glue, resins and more. You will learn how to ink and prepare plates in order to make successful prints, explore texture, layers and colour areas creating images using simple collected waste textured materials.

You will explore the possibilities of collagraph printmaking using techniques such as simple registration on the press bed to create layered and multi coloured prints, printing over textural collagraph images with found materials, blind embossing, multi coloured inking to create monoprint images.

Digital Illustration | *Tutor: Isabella Kuijers*

This one-day workshop will provide you with the foundations for using the Procreate App. The Procreate App is a powerful, portable and intuitive drawing resource. In this course we will learn how to create an image in Procreate using layers, blending modes, masks and many of its other exciting features.

B&W Darkroom Photography | Tutor: Simon Fernandez

This course is ideal for beginners who would like to learn how to print their own black and white photos. Students will be shown how to use the darkroom, enlargers, and photographic chemistry properly to achieve successful results. You will be taught the correct method of assessing a negative, making test strips, contact sheets, prints and photograms. Students can also learn how to process their own black and white films. The course is very practical, and darkroom safety is highlighted throughout.

2 Days: Landscape Photography | Tutor: Neil White

Why landscape photography? Maybe you enjoy being in nature and want to share the experience. You want to tell a story but what is the story in the landscape? You want to bring your personality to the photograph – your unique vision and style. We explore the camera settings, lenses and filters that can enhance your landscape photography. We use the Thames and local heaths for practical photo shoot sessions where you will get hands on assistant. All the important elements of shooting interesting landscape will be explored such as composition and the use of differing light such as the gold hour.

The course will include interactive lectures, critiques sessions of your pictures and looking at well-known photographers work in this field. There will be a substantial practical element with lively photo shoots in various locations in the city.

Expert knowledge and tips will be given from a professional photographer who has experience of landscape photography.

Lightroom and Photoshop for Photographers | *Tutor: Simon Fernandez*

Learn how to edit, colour correct, and make adjustments to your photos to bring out their true potential. This course will guide you through the process of image manipulation software to attain professional results from your camera.

3 Days: Introduction to Pottery | Tutor: Leigh Jenkinson

This three-day workshop will introduce beginners to the basic throwing and handbuilding techniques for creating forms in clay. Your experienced tutor will also demonstrate these techniques and guide you with your own work.

Create a Character for Children's Books | Tutor: Sophie Ambrose

On this one-day course you'll be shown how to create a character for children's picture books. We'll start with looking at some examples of picture books and how illustrators create characters, with plenty of examples to inspire you. Through some fun creative exercises, you'll develop a character and start to think of the world of your character.

2 Days: Introduction to Drawing & Colour | *Tutor: Sophie Ambrose*

On this two-day 'taster' course you will be introduced to some of the basic skills of observational drawing and colour. On day one, we'll focus on drawing skills including line, space, proportion and tone. On day two, we'll focus on colour starting with colour theory/mixing using acrylic paints and creating a painting later in the day. There'll be demos and plenty of one-to-one attention and examples of artists work to inspire you.

For Adults

Composition & Colour: Drawing & Painting

on the River Thames: Alex Katz | Tutor: Ian Ellis

On day 1, through demonstration, ideas are presented about how Katz simplifies composition and colour. You will then select paintings for your own individual study. On day 2 and 3, on location by the Thames, using pencil, you will search for composition. Then, you will attempt to construct your own paintings working with both your own ideas and any ideas identified during the first day's analysis.

2 Days: Life Drawing (All Levels) | Tutor: Shaun Carey

This two-day course is open to both beginners and the experienced student alike. The aim of the course is to encourage students to develop their drawing and painting skills via access to what some consider the most compelling form, the human body. The emphasis will be on observation, building upon basic principles of drawing and moving towards personal expression through experimentation with various media and techniques.

2 Days: Experimental Art & Media | Tutor: Eithne Healy

This is a taster course, introducing you to new ways of seeing and working. Through a series of experimental and practical exercises students will 'test out' and expand their understanding of materials and processes generating ideas for drawings and 3D objects/forms. Responding to a range of different subject matter and stimuli students will explore visual and conceptual ideas/themes towards how you can create both large (installation) and small-scale works whilst employing a variety of media

2 Days: Experimental Landscape Painting | Tutor: Nigel Murray

Landscapes are the starting point for exploring different ways to paint. Weather permitting, we will go outside to do sketches and take photos for use back in the studio.

We will try out wet into wet techniques, the use of masking fluid, acrylic medium for glazing, candle wax and adding materials like salt. This will lead to creating your own personal response/s.

Watercolour Painting (All Levels) | Tutor: Shaun Carey

You will be taught about colour mixing and a range of watercolour techniques. You will be finding ways to express colour, light and texture using watercolour techniques. We will be experimenting with different ways of using paint and will look at how watercolour painters use various techniques.

Open Studio Etching | Tutor: Melanie Bellis

Open studio Etching sessions are available to those who already have experience of etching and are interested in developing their own projects. This is an opportunity to work independently and develop your work. Tutor input and support is available throughout if needed.

3 Days: Etching All Level | Tutor: Melanie Bellis

This is a practical, workshop-based course for beginners, those wanting to refresh their skills and also for experienced students. As a beginner you will be taught the core etching processes, hard ground, soft ground and aquatint, through demonstrations, and handson practice preparing and printing your own etchings. As a more experienced printmaker you will be able to pursue your own projects with 1:1 guidance and support, to enable you to develop your ideas and stretch your skills.

Experimental Etched Lino Printing | Tutor: Paul Schofield


With the guidance of an experienced printmaker, you will develop a new approach to lino printing to advance your practice with backgrounds and effects that will develop your imagery. This course will introduce you to the potential of etching your linocut designs to bring in advanced art marking with caustic soda and various resists The workshop begins with the basic techniques through planning your design, creating your linocut block or blocks and takes your through all the stages of working energy and gesture into your designs.

2 Days: Collagraph Printmaking

| Tutor: Paul Schofield

A two-day course where you will create collagraph plates using simple found materials, textured papers, glue, resins and more. You will learn how to ink and prepare plates in order to make successful prints, explore texture, layers and colour areas creating images using simple collected waste textured materials.

You will explore the possibilities of collagraph printmaking using techniques such as simple registration on the press bed to create layered and multi coloured prints, printing over textural collagraph images with found materials, blind embossing, multi coloured inking to create monoprint images.



2 Days: Drawing & Printmaking from Sculpture

| Tutor: Paul Schofield

Using Sculpture as an observational starting point you will collect drawings to use as inspiration for printmaking. looking at the energy and gesture of monoprint and relief printmaking in general. On this two-day course, you will create a range of print from initial drawings made from Sculpture. These drawings will be used to make a range of print techniques that help to create that quality of weight and form in your images and help you make decisions about design and composition of work.

Intensive Throwing Week | *Tutor: John Dawson*

This course is aimed at throwers that would like to perfect and fine tune their throwing technique. Students will be able to work for 5 consecutive days on individual projects guided by an experienced tutor. Throwers will be shown different methods of throwing forms and introducing some manipulation of the forms.

B&W Darkroom Photography | *Tutor: Simon Fernandez*

This course is ideal for beginners who would like to learn how to print their own black and white photos. Students will be shown how to use the darkroom, enlargers, and photographic chemistry properly to achieve successful results. You will be taught the correct method of assessing a negative, making test strips, contact sheets, prints and photograms. Students can also learn how to process their own black and white films. This short street photography course is well structured, informative and will make the process of capturing interesting and creative street images as simple as possible. Your imagination will be stretched, development of your skills and your confidence will be boosted. Whilst we cover the technicalities (such as camera settings, light and composition), our main focus is on teaching you the essential skills to help you become an accomplished street photographer, conquering your fear of shooting on the streets, understanding what makes a strong image and helping you develop your own style and approach. We will focus on the art of street photography along with technique to get the perfect combination.

The course will include interactive lectures, critiques sessions of your pictures and looking at well-known photographers work in this field. There will be a substantial practical element with lively photo shoots in various locations in the city. Expert knowledge and tips will be given from a professional photographer who has experience of street photography.

Open Studio (Pottery) | Tutor: Belinda Bates

Open studio sessions are available to those that already have experience working with clay and are interested in working on their own projects. You will be expected to manage the progress of your own work although advice will be available if required.

2 Days: Introduction to Pottery 14 Plus | Tutor: Sarah Deeks

This two-day workshop will introduce beginners to the basic throwing and handbuilding techniques for creating forms in clay. Your experienced tutor will also demonstrate these techniques and guide you with your own work.

Learn to Draw Taster | *Tutor: Isabella Kuijers*

Open Studio (Painting) | Tutor: Isabella Kuijers

You will be expected to manage the progress of your own work although advice will be available if required from an experienced tutor. You can use this time and space to finish existing projects or begin new ones.

Portrait Drawing (All levels) | *Tutor: Eithne Healy*

An intensive one-day course working with varied approaches to portrait drawing.

Applying some lively and exploratory exercises to observational work, students will test out different drawing materials and approaches to this subject; line, tone and gestural mark - making with a view to creating a unique body of responses on paper.

2 Days: Life Drawing (All Levels) | Tutor: Eithne Healy

This two-day course is open to both beginners and the experienced student alike. The aim of the course is to encourage students to develop their drawing and painting skills via access to what some consider the most compelling form, the human body. The emphasis will be on observation, building upon basic principles of drawing and moving towards personal expression through experimentation with various media and techniques.

2 Days: Experimental Art & Media

| Tutor: Eithne Healy

This is a taster course, introducing you to new ways of seeing and working. Through a series of experimental and practical exercises students will 'test out' and expand their understanding of materials and processes generating ideas for drawings and 3D objects/forms.

Responding to a range of different subject matter and stimuli students will explore visual and conceptual ideas/themes towards how you can create both large (installation) and small scale works whilst employing a variety of media.



2 Days: Architectural Drawing & Painting: Expressions

Weather permitting, we will go outside, sketching buildings and taking photos to use as reference material back in the studio. We will explore different creative ways of responding to the built environment and experimenting with a variety of materials and techniques. We will look at a range of artists including: jJohn Piper, Edward Hopper, Thomas Jones, Antoni Gaudi, Anselm Kieffer and Vincent van Gogh.

Introduction to Drawing | *Tutor: Isabella Kuijers*

You will learn the basic principles of observational drawing, beginning with simple shapes and proportion through to conveying volume and space. You will learn to use pencil, charcoal and other medium to describe form and light. Using a variety of materials, you will explore different forms of description and expression

Introduction to Landscape Drawing | *Tutor: Nigel Murray*

We will explore the subject of Landscape using a variety of drawing media to develop exciting personal responses. Weather permitting, we will go outside to do sketching from direct observation as well as taking photos to provide reference material to use back in the studio.



Introduction to Interior Design 14 plus

| Tutor: Sniez Tobarina

The course is an introduction to the subject of interior design, how it relates to a wider architectural setting, and sustainability aspect. It will include elements of drawing the plans, sketching the space by hand drawing methods with introduction to CAD dwg and Photoshop, and working with colour and materials.

Open Studio Etching

Tutor: Melanie Bellis

Open studio Etching sessions are available to those who already have experience of etching and are interested in developing their own projects. This is an opportunity to work independently and develop your work. Tutor input and support is available throughout if needed.



3 Days: Alternative Sustainable Etching (All Levels)

Tutor: Catherine Greenwood

Explore the potential of Copper Plate Etching over 2 days using Ferric Chloride acid and Soywax and B.I.G grounds. Suitable as an introduction to etching for beginners or for those who wish to develop their etching skills for a home printmaking studio. Preparing plates, etching and printing your own image using contemporary materials with traditional techniques under the guidance of an experienced tutor.

2 Days: Experimental Printmaking | Tutor: Paul Schofield

The two days will provide opportunities for you to explore all aspects of relief printing including Linoleum cut, Collagraph, Mono-type, Mono-print, Mono-drawing, Tetra-Pak packaging and hybrid combinations. You will develop ideas as you experiment with processes and techniques, images and textures. Students attending range from beginners to experienced printers and the sharing of skills and knowledge benefits all in this lively class. Through demonstrations and individual support for students in gaining understanding of media and processes, you will be encouraged to develop original and well executed printed outcomes.

Monoprinting | Tutor: Melanie Bellis

This is a taster course introducing Monoprinting, this technique involves making an image on a surface that can then be printed onto paper using a printing press. Monoprinting is a fantastic way to try out new ideas and explore painterly and expressive mark making. On this course you will first work in a single colour and then learn to use multiple colours. Suitable for beginners or as a refresher.

2 Dyas: Watercolour - Painting Seasonal Flowers


